Pastor's Message



This Sunday – as is the practice on the First Sunday of Lent at Notre-Dame Cathedral, the Archbishop will welcome for the Rite of Election those who are journeying in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) program in our diocese. By this Rite, those adults who are not baptized will become "catechumens", officially members of our Catholic Church, as they begin the proximate preparation for the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) at the Easter Vigil. We are

informed by Diocesan Pastoral Services that there is a remarkable increase in the number of adults who are intending to be baptized this year – almost triple the average of recent years. Among the group are three adults from our parish who have been exploring, praying and discussing about our faith for some months. They will share their journey in a public way with us by the celebration of the Scrutinies on three of the coming Sundays of Lent. Their public expression of their faith journey is a blessing for our faith community who accompanies them. Please keep them in your prayers as we experience the solidarity of our Lenten pilgrimage.

During my 2016 sabbatical in Rome, I had the opportunity during Lent to participate in the daily pilgrimage to the Station Churches of Rome. Pope St. Gregory the Great standardized the Stational Churches in Rome around the year 600, and since that time, they have, with few exceptions, remained the same. The faithful observed the "stations" by first gathering at a specified church in the city. They walked in procession to the shrine of an apostle or martyr at the stational church, the daily *statio* ("standing place"), designated for that day. The word *statio* derives from the Latin verb *sto*, "to stand" and signified how early Christians gathered and "stood with" the local clergy in this special procession and liturgy. One way to participate in this Lenten tradition of Rome is to use the book *Roman Pilgrimage: The Station Churches* of which George Weigel is the principal author. It is also a way to make a "virtual pilgrimage to Rome" during this Jubilee Year.

Our Parish Finance Council met last Tuesday. The members welcomed Anita Caputo who served on the Finance Council some years ago. The Council continues to review and clarify the Financial Report for 2024, prepare the 2025 Budget and consider ways to improve the financial reporting. With respect to a review of our facilities, the members took note of a number of repairs and replacements that will be necessary this year, including roof leaks in the church entrances and sacristy corridor; replacement of one of the heating units of the church HVAC system; and the installation of the attic windows in the rectory and of the related facia. The Council will next meet on Tuesday March 25.
